PRESS STATEMENT ON CABINET SECRETARY'S TWO-DAY WORKING VISIT TO SUDAN

The Cabinet Secretary for Foreign Affairs Amb. Raychelle Omamo, held extensive consultations with her counterpart the Foreign Minister of the Republic of the Sudan in Khartoum H.E. Mariam Assadiq Al Mahdion on June 4, 2021.

Their discussions centred on renewing and energizing the fraternal relations and promoting trade and investment. They agreed to hold the Kenya-Sudan Joint Commission for Cooperation by August 2021.

The Ministers welcomed the good progress made by the Sudan in implementing the transition and affirmed Kenya's support to The Sudan and availability to share experiences in broad-based reform.

The two Ministers met and dialogued with women leaders on the global agenda on the role of women in peace and security. Women need to embrace leadership positions and to ensure that their voices are heard in national discourse.

The Ministers agreed to hold consultations regularly.

Cabinet Secretary Amb. Omamo was accompanied by Amb. Ngeiwa Mkala, Kenya's Ambassador to Sudan; Amb. George Orina, Director Africa and African Union; and, Mr. Edwin Mutava, Director Peace and Security.
